
2022 Friends 4 of Scouting Update

WiFi Extended to Campsites at Henson

By popular demand wifi access has been extended to campsites at Henson Scout Reservation to better accommodate the growing need for online access for remote working parents. This ongoing project was

funded by the very generous Henson Staff Alumni Association and is utilized daily. Future plans include electrifying additional campsites and extending wifi even further!





"Do You Dare to Try our Zip!" asks Camp Rodney





The final step into a relocated Scoutcraft area, a zipline, was installed this winter. The zip starts on the new pedestrian walkway observation platform and lands in tric service into the site, and inthe Scoutcraft area and campsite called "Jump Cannon". This final phase of the multi-year traffic safety enhancement project started in 2017. It was designed to improve the safety of pedestrian campers on the main camp road. The first phase included a nearly 1/3 mile traffic separation project that widened the roadway corridor to accommodate guard rail and create a 10' protected walkway. A bridge, and an

observation platform were included. The second phase sawconstruction of a 1200 s.f. pavilion, extension of the camp elecstallation of a unique composting toilet system. The final phase, funded by a generous grant, saw the installation of overhead cables from the walkway observation platform, across an existing ravine, to a constructed landing on one edge of the Jump Cannon campsite. This side-by-side two rider zip will provide thrill seekers an opportunity to "fly" into the Scoutcraft area.
