Prevention and Protection

The health and safety of our Scouts, Leaders and staff are our top priority, and are of the utmost importance to the Del-Mar-Va Council. We are continually monitoring guidance from state and local health officials and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) regarding the Covid-19 pandemic and its impacts on our summer operations. This is an ever evolving situation and information will be updated as it becomes available.

It is important to note that we as a Scouting community must remain flexible.





Prevention and Protection

Prevention

- **1 Occupant per tent (this will require units to bring tents to meet their need, the following slide shows how many tents will be made available in each site)**
- **Program Modifications**
- **Activities including meals will be done outdoors whenever possible**
- **Temperature checks will be done daily in the campsite and monitored by unit leaders**
- **Anyone who is flagged for showing signs of illness will not be permitted in camp or will be isolated until removed from camp**
- **Gaga Pits will be closed entirely**

Protection

- **Everyone must have a mask for each day of the week and have it on their person for use when required**
- **Handwashing and Sanitizing stations will be readily available throughout camp**
- **Program Sessions and Meals will begin with handwashing**
- **Program areas, buildings, and comfort stations will be cleaned and sanitized regularly**
- **Trading Post Window Service and a limited number of people inside**





Prior to Leaving Home

- All participants must have their temperature checked prior to leaving home. If cleared they should proceed to the unit meeting location.
- Participants will be required complete an at-home 14 day quarantine prior to coming to camp. Daily temperature and symptom checks must be recorded on this form and turned in upon arrival at camp.
- Form will be emailed, and be available on RSR webpage.
- Each attendee must complete the form / self quarantine for 14 days prior to arrival.
- All occupants of vehicle must have form completed.
- Form must be presented upon arrival to camp, before you will be allowed out of your vehicle. **Have this form on your person**

In an effort to minimize illness at camp we ask that you check on the health of your camper daily beginning 14 days prior to camp. The best camp sessions start with healthy campers and this begins at home. Please bring this completed form to camp on opening day.

Please indicate if your camper has any of the following symptoms prior to camp and record a temperature daily. If any temperature or symptoms are present, please have your camper evaluated by a licensed provider and contact camp for further guidance.

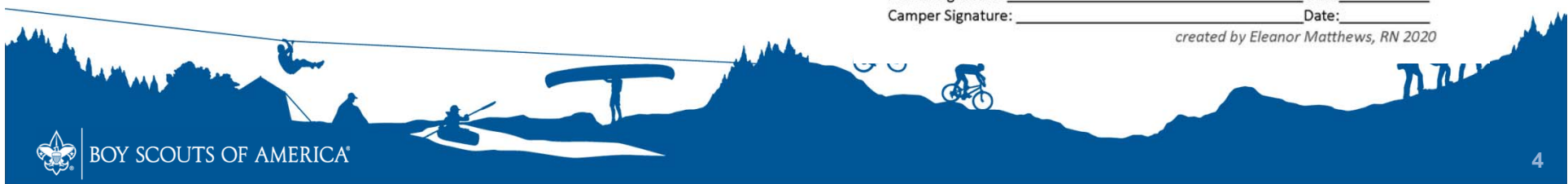

Prior to Leaving Home

- At the meeting location, a unit leader should complete the [Pre-Event Checklist](#) for each participant. This checklist will be attached to the participants medical form and must be presented to our medical team at camp.
- Travel from the meeting location to Rodney in as many vehicles as possible (preferably each household will send 1 vehicle).
- We strongly recommend that units do not travel by bus or passenger van. If one occupant is flagged, all occupants of the vehicle will not be permitted into camp.
- Each occupant of a vehicle MUST have the completed Pre-Event Checklist on their person to display at the wellness checkpoint on camp road.





Sunday Arrival and Check-in



- Your unit will be assigned an arrival time between 1p.m. and 4 p.m. This will be communicated via email and phone at least 1 week prior to your arrival.
- Before a car is permitted to enter the parking lot, all occupants will have their temperature checked. If all are cleared, the vehicle will proceed to a designated area in the parking lot. If an occupant is flagged, the vehicle will proceed to a designated area for further evaluation.

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Sunday Arrival and Check-in

A preliminary health check in will occur on camp road in the vicinity of the “Clean” sign. Staff members will be stationed in that area to review the completed “pre-event medical screening checklists” of ALL occupants of vehicles and take temperatures of ALL occupants of vehicle. These staff members will be wearing facemasks and gloves.



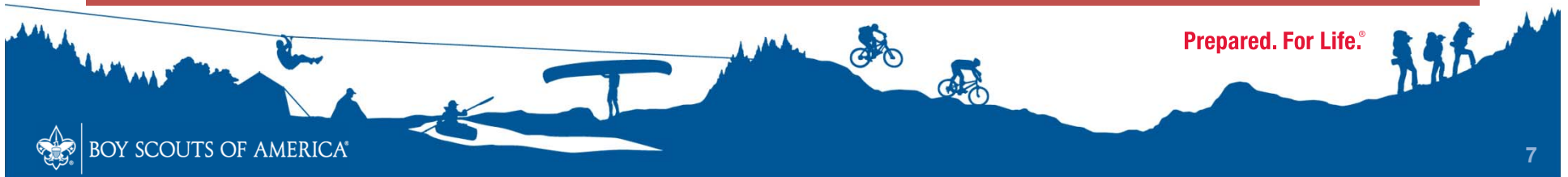
Once cleared to campsite parking, units will be permitted one vehicle per site to unload troop gear. Once entire unit has arrived, staff “campsite zone guide” will call for medical check-in team to conduct review of AHMRs, pre-event checklists, and additional temperature checks. Dietary needs forms will be completed/collected at this time.



Units should plan to remain in their site for the remainder of the afternoon. Programming and some games will be provided, but we are encouraging units to bring things like badminton sets, cornhole boards, etc. for use in the campsite.



Swim checks will not be done on Sunday.



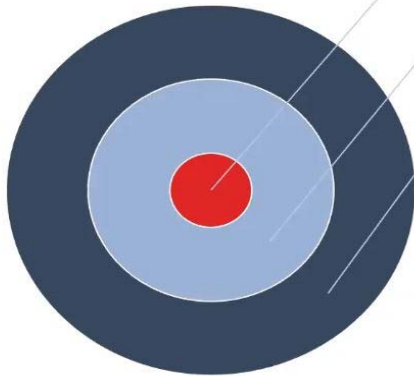

Concentric Circle Concept



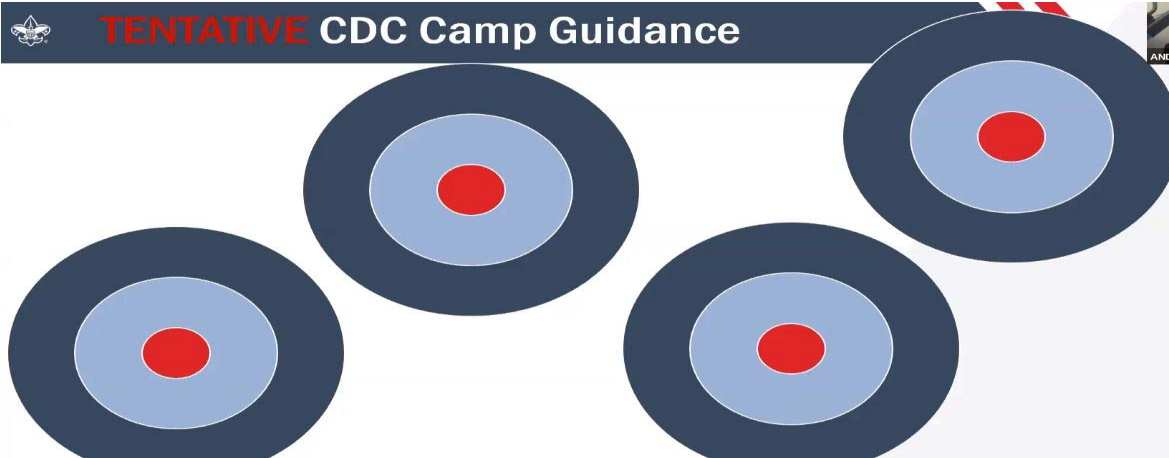
2 staff "unit leaders"

TENTATIVE CDC Camp Guidance



- Campers will be put into "CC Groups" based on their size and campsite
- Once in their group, campers will only interact with that group of no more than 50 for the entire week
- We can accommodate up to 10 groups a week in camp

Dining Plan

- **Lenape Camp will remain as heaterstack food service.**
- **Wilderness and Pathfinder Camps:**
- **All meals will be served from the dining hall in hot boxes.**
- **Scheduled times for pick up will be assigned**
- **NO seating will be available in the dining hall**
- **Larger portions because seconds will not be offered**
- **No salad bar- premade salads will be available for takeout**
- **Concentric Groups will be assigned a time to report to the Dining Hall to pick up each meal**
- **Units will be able to return to their campsite or designated program area for that day to eat**



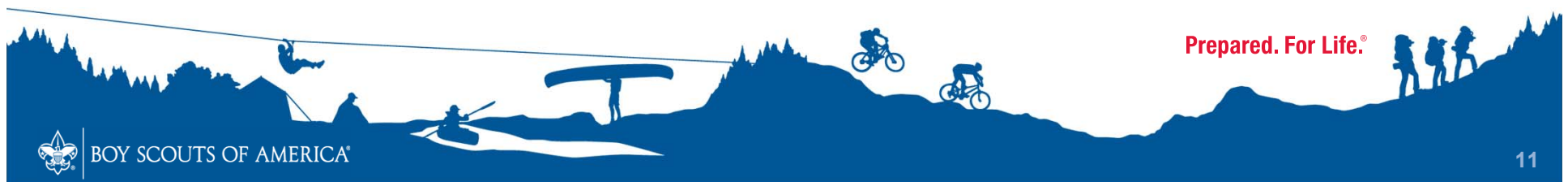
